Cheers and applause reverberated off the walls of the brand new Mission Chapel as family, friends and mentors gathered in celebration of our New Life Program graduates. On February 14th, the Mission had the privilege of presenting six men, who successfully completed the 12-month residential recovery program, with their certificate of completion.

Nick Kerner, Kenneth Clark, Martin Johnson, Donald Staaf, Mike Amboyer and Andrew Stepp, were commemorated for their commitment to recovery, through music, fellowship, Bible readings, and a word of encouragement and advice from 2014 NLP graduate, Sam Meyer.

Graduations at the Erie City Mission are held every 10-weeks, and celebrate the accomplishments each graduate has made, with God's help, during their journey to long-term recovery. "Every time we hold a graduation, it is a testimony to God's unfailing love," said Darrell Smith, Director of Men's Ministries. "In Deuteronomy, Joshua is told that God '...will never leave you, nor forsake you;' God has intervened in each one of these men's lives to fulfill that promise. That is why we gather to celebrate

with family and friends as they enter this new season of recovery and restoration."

The New Life Program truly is a transformational program--men are being restored to loving fathers, sons, brothers, uncles, nephews and grandfathers. Nick Kerner, who graduated

in February, says its hard to put into words what the program really means to him. "The Mission gave me the opportunity and the tools to grow my faith and dive into my recovery," he explains. "They gave me a future that I once

believed was never possible, and I am so grateful for that."

Expanding Aftercare Support

For men graduating from the Mission's New Life recovery program, the restoration

and transformation doesn't stop at the ceremony. For some time now, the Erie City Mission has worked to assist our NLP men to find housing following their graduation. Currently, graduates are offered continued housing at the Mission, for up to 90 days, as they look for employment and a long-term residence. Alternative housing options would open up beds and the opportunity for new men to enter into our recovery program more quickly. To this aim, the Mission recently entered into a lease agreement for a 6 bedroom apartment, located at the Sesler building next door, allowing us to offer housing for up to 8 men who have graduated our program.

"The Sesler house will enable us to provide a safe transitional environment for our participants--a true blessing for those we serve!" said Darrell Smith. The expansion of the Mission's aftercare support, is a great benefit to our graduates; allowing our men to maintain close proximity to the Mission, while moving toward independence and integrating back into the community.

The Erie City Mission is delighted to be partnering with Saint Vincent Hospital, AHN to provide our public lunch and emergency shelter guests with access to their mobile medical unit.

SaintVincent introduced its exclusive Mobile Medical Unit in August of 2013. The 40-foot medical-office-on-wheels delivers corporate wellness programs "on the go" to organizations throughout our community.

The Mobile Medical Unit visits the Mission multiple times a month [parking on 11th Street] to provide the following on-site services to our guests: physical examinations and preventative health exams; on-site dietician services; blood pressure screenings; and diabetes management education. The Mission is grateful to community partners like Saint Vincent Hospital, AHN, for offering valuable resources to help those who come to the Mission daily.
