

The Man On The Cover - Meet Randy

When Randy walked through the doors of the Erie City Mission seeking shelter in June 2020, it was the last place he ever expected to find himself.

Tell us about your story. What brought you to the Erie City Mission?

It was the first time in my life I was ever homeless and struggling to get my life together. I was sleeping in the back of long trucks, under bridges...really any place I could find to keep me warm, that's where I slept. I knew I couldn't stay on the streets. I ran into a couple of friends who told me to go to the MHA (Mental Health Association) and it was there that I called 814-SHELTER and got a bed at the Samaritan Care Shelter.

What was your first night in the Samaritan Care Shelter like?

To be able to sleep on a bed, take a hot shower and be able to get something to eat, it was beautiful. They [the Mission] served breakfast and lunch and then you only had to walk a block away to Emmaus to get dinner. I was getting my three meals and I was doing good.

Once those immediate needs were met, how did the Mission help you get back on your feet?

They helped me out a lot. I was struggling to get my SSI checks. The shelter staff took the time to call the social security office and the welfare office for me, and helped move things along faster. Whatever they could do to help me out they did. If you asked them questions, they would help you out, you just had to ask. You only have 90 days to stay in the shelter, but I received an extension because they knew I was working on getting an apartment. Once my SSI came through, the Mission connected me with Stairways to get a BCM (Blended Case Manager) so I could start the process of finding an apartment.

How long have you been in your apartment and how does it feel to have your own place?

I left the Mission in December 2020 and have been in my apartment for 4 months. It took me a while to find an apartment because there wasn't a lot of landlords renting at the time. But I found one and I am loving it. I have friends that come and visit. The shelter staff want to visit me at my new place too, to make sure I am comfortable and have what I need…because that's what they do.

What advice would you have for someone who is experiencing homelessness?

Keep your head up and pay attention because there is someone who is on your side. It doesn't make sense to be laying on the streets. There are places for men and women to go. You need to take the first step. When I realized that, it brought me back to reality. I will never do it again, never again.

Urban University Students Learn About Entrepreneurship

Six Urban University students launched their first youth commerce merchandise store in late March as part of the program's first ever Youth Commerce Collaborative. Students enrolled in the course were provided an intensive hands-on entrepreneurial experience that followed every aspect of the clothing and screen printing business including sales, marketing, design, production, finance and leadership.

RJ Messenger, owner of Iron Empire Clothing, partnered with the Erie City Mission's youth program as the first business to participate in the course, donating company resources, time and money. Messenger opened the doors for these students to learn what it takes to be a business owner and entrepreneur.

Students worked together to create two unique designs that they screen printed onto T-shirts and hoodies. Their apparel was available for purchase online through their own e-commerce store in March and generated \$1,825 in revenue for the Urban University Program. Each student received a gift card to Iron Empire Clothing for meeting their intended sales goal.

"If I ever wanted to start a business, I know how to start it and where I need to be, what I need to do financially and what I need to do for myself," said Nathanael Elverton, an Urban University student.

Urban University is seeking to partner with other businesses like Iron Empire Clothing, to help shape students as future leaders. The Erie City Mission's Samaritan Care Shelter provides emergency shelter services that meet immediate and practical needs for men experiencing homelessness, hunger and despair. By meeting these most basic and immediate needs, not tied to any expectations, we are "restoring hope" in a nurturing environment and opening doors for transformation to begin.

Guests in our shelter are cared for in a safe, supportive environment where they can find refuge and rest. Once those needs have been addressed, a case manager works one-on-one with each guest to identify next steps, including housing, employment, and healthcare and treatment options with a goal of helping guests change unhealthy patterns of behavior.

Each night approximately 56 men find a warm bed and safety from the streets at the Erie City Mission. If you or someone you know is in need of shelter, please call the Coordinated Entry System at 814-SHELTER (814-743-5837).
